## What is your hope in?

In the fall I spoke at a missions conference in Regina where the theme was "Jesus is the Hope of the World". I have recently had the privilege of to speaking in a couple local churches, and I was drawn to present that key message. It is the central, non-negotiable reality that must be understood in our broken world.

Three realities that come forward in this:

- 1. We all put our hope in something. And what we put our hope in, is also what or who we worship. Ed Welch, author of Addictions, A Banquet in the Grave, would say addictions is a worship disorder. Where is your hope? Who do you trust-and therefore worshipmore than anyone else?
- 2. Is Jesus your only hope? This is personal. Most of us are very familiar with Jesus conversation with Nicodemus in John 3. Jesus explicitly says, "Unless one is born again, he cannot see the Kingdom of God." This is a very personal matter. Are you born again? Have you turned in faith and repentance to Jesus as your only hope for now and eternity?
- 3. As much as belief in Jesus Christ is a personal matter, it's not a private matter. Jesus was lifted up on the cross publicly, the apostles spoke boldly in public, and Jesus commissioned all Christians to take the good news to all peoples.
